

Whereas it appears from the report  
of the Inspector in the Chickasaw Na-  
tion that there is now in the hands  
of the Chickasaw Nation the sum  
of \$1959.<sup>23</sup> collected as royalty  
(this being  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the amount collected)  
and whereas repeated demands  
have been made by our Inspector  
for said amount and whereas there  
are other amounts due on ma-  
terials handled by the Timber  
Agent of the Chickasaw Nation,  
therefore:

Be it resolved by the General Coun-  
cil of the Choctaw Nation assembled  
That the National Agent is hereby  
instructed, ~~in connection with~~  
~~our Inspector,~~ to use all diligence  
in his power for collecting the  
amounts due - by suit or otherwise.  
And this Resolution shall  
take effect & be in force from  
and after its passage -
