

AN ACT REJECTING THE APPLICATION OF DAVID W. WEEDEN ET AL TO CITIZENSHIP IN THE CHOCTAW NATION.

Be it enacted by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled- That the application of David W. Weeden and his wife Dilea Weeden and their children Melissa Weeden, Lewis Weeden, John Weeden, Hugh Weeden, Lee Weeden, Minnie Weeden, Lidia Weeden, Harry Weeden, Mark Weeden & Lillie Weeden and Dee Weeden; also their grand children being the children of Melissa by her marriage with Benjamin Luckridge, to wit. Carl Luckridge, William Luckridge and George Luckridge-- Also Lafayette Weeden, brother of the applicant, and his wife Mary Weeden and their children William Weeden, George Weeden, Price Weeden, Alva Weeden, Herbert Weeden, Lester Weeden, Earnest Weeden, Benjamin Weeden, Henry Weeden and Laura Weeden; and also their grand children, being the children of George Weeden by his marriage to Maud Weeden, to wit, Marinda Lee Weeden, Dallas L. Weeden, and Delia Weeden to citizenship in the Choctaw Nation is hereby rejected.

And the said David W. Weeden and all the Claimants with him and by him are hereby declared non-citizens of the Choctaw Nation, And this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
