

AN ACT REPEALING AN ACT APPROVED NOV. 8th. 1889 CONFERRING CITIZENSHIP ON RICHARD BENJAMIN COLEMAN ET AL.

Be it enacted by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation Assembled- That the Act of the General Council approved Nov. 8th. 1889 granting to Richard Benjamin Coleman, and his wife Eva Coleman and their children Richard St. Clair, and Ida Clay, and Brunette and Bettie Withers, and Henry Allen, and Willie Norman, rights, privileges and immunities of citizenship in the Choctaw Nation is hereby repealed.

And the said R.B. Coleman, wife and children are hereby declared non-citizens of the Choctaw Nation.
