

An Act to fund the outstanding warrants of the Choctaw Nation-

Be it enacted by  
the General Council of the  
Choctaw Nation assembled-  
That the Principal Chief and  
his Cabinet, or a majority  
of them, are hereby consti-  
tuted a Board of Finance,  
It shall be the duty of said  
Board to make up <sup>the</sup> Tushka-  
hounna, in the manner and  
form herein after provided,  
and take up all outstand-  
ing legal warrants of the  
Choctaw Nation and issue  
in lieu thereof warrants  
of like number and amount  
drawing six per cent interest  
with conditions on their face as  
hereinafter provided- That  
as new warrants are issued  
they shall be entered in a Register  
kept for that purpose, according  
to priority of dates, numbering  
the oldest warrant No 1 and

registering the next deadsh  
warrant consecutively until  
all are registered-

See 2 Be it further enacted &c.  
For the purposes of this Act  
the Principal Chief is hereby  
authorized to publish, at a  
cost not to exceed ~~five~~ five dollars for each  
News paper, a Notice in one  
News paper in each of the  
following places, to wit, the  
Choctaw Nation, Division and  
Paris Texas and Ft Smith Ark.  
Said Notice shall name the  
time and place of meeting of  
the Board and the intents  
and purposes of this Act, and  
shall run for at least 30  
days.

See 3 Be it further enacted- That  
the new warrants issued under  
this Act shall contain a clause  
in their body of them, saying  
they are subject to call for pay-  
ment at any time by the National  
Treasurer published in one  
paper in the Choctaw Nation.

and that they shall cease to draw interest at the end of 30 days from date of such call for their presentation and payment by the Treasurer

Sec 4 Be it further enacted - That upon the completion of its labors the Board shall turn over the Register prepared by them to the National Treasurer, who shall keep it and thereafter as money comes in to the Treasury he shall pay off all registered warrants commencing with No 1 of the Register and continuing consecutive -ly until all are paid; Provided - The Treasurer, when any money comes into his hands, ~~shall~~ publish a notice in one paper in the Choctaw Nation, giving the number, payee and amount of each warrant to be called for payment; and said notice shall run for 30 days, and all warrants named in said call must be presented within ten days after

the expiration of said notice  
and call, shall cease to draw  
interest and shall be placed  
at the end of the register  
and not paid until the entire  
registered list has been paid  
or legally called -

Sec 5 Be it further enacted - The  
Treasurer shall not be allowed  
to pay any warrant except  
as herein provided until the  
~~to~~ entire registered list has  
been liquidated - Provided  
No warrant not registered  
as herein provided shall  
draw any interest -
