You are respectfully advised that it is desired by the Department that all Acts of the national councils of the different nations of the Indian Territory hereafter forwarded to be submitted to the President of the United States for executive action be not folded or rolled. This can be accomplished by the use of portfolios, or envelopes, of sufficient size to contain your Acts, to which end a supply thereof is this date sent you under separate cover for use in sending Acts of the Choctaw National Council to this office, and you are respectfully requested to use them in all instances for this purpose. If possible all the Acts of any one council should be sent under one cover. Care should be taken in the preparation of your Acts to see that they are not folded in any manner before they are transmitted to this office.

Postage will not be required on these envelopes.
