Sir:

Hon. J. M. Wilson of Washington, D. C. has presented to the  
Indian Office at Washington a Choctaw National Warrant as follows:

National Auditor's Warrant.

Tuska Homma, Ind.Ter., Nov. 26, 1897.

The Treasurer of the Choctaw Nation:  
Pay to the order of Green McCurtain \$5,000 00/100

Five thousand-----00/00Dollars out of the  
National Treasury appropriated to pay National expenses.

Chairman to carry out  
"Commission Act Approved Nov. 4, 1897."  
S. M. Woods,  
Auditor."  
(Endorsed by Green McCurtain).

This warrant was never presented to me and hence I had no  
opportunity to pass upon it. The Auditor's reports and Treasurer's  
reports are in your possession. Will you please look at the  
Auditor's report for the year beginning the first of October, 1897,

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and see whether or not the above warrant was duly and properly issued to Governor McCurtain and advise me of the entry. Will you also examine the Treasurer's reports, which are in your possession, subsequently to that date, and advise me whether or not the same has been paid.

I find from examining my report to the Secretary that Wesley Anderson is the present holder of a warrant for \$1,000 dated November 26, 1897, issued to Green McCurtain and numbered 37. The question with me is what this warrant for \$1,000 and numbered 37 is for? Is it a "split" warrant or is it a separate one? I wish you would send me a copy of the appropriation act under which this warrant for \$5,000 was issued. In other words, will you give me all the information possible touching this warrant, to the end that I may make a report to the Indian Office as to whether the same should be paid.
