the Property and right of New Hope Seminary.

Be it enacted by the General Council
of the Choctaw Nation Assembled;

Sec 1. That the present right and
property connected or belonging
to the New Hope Seminary, be
and the same is hereby made
subject to sale

Sec 2. Be it further enacted, That the
National Treasurer of the Choctaw
Nation is hereby authorized and
directed to, ^{make said} disposition ~~within~~ by
public or private sale of when
ever household goods or other property
belonging to New Hope Seminary.

Sec 3. Be it further enacted, That the
proceeds from said sale shall
be placed in the National
Treasury, a full and complete
^{report} thereof ~~shall~~ ^{to} be made by the
National Treasurer to the next
succeeding regular session of Council,
and that this act take effect and
be in force from and after its
passage.
