CHOCTAW NATION.

AN ACT  
for the relief of Henry Willis.

WHEREAS, Your Committee having under investigation the report of Henry Willis, Superintendent of Tushkaloosa Academy, found that the aforesaid superintendent had exceeded the appropriation allowed him in the sum of Three hundred and seventy-one dollars and twenty-seven cents, (\$371.27,), by reason of discounts and interest, THEREFORE,

Be it enacted by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation Assembled:

Section 1. That the sum of Three hundred and seventy-one dollars, and twenty seven cents, (\$371.27,), be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the relief of Henry Willis.

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That the National Auditor is hereby authorized and instructed to issue his warrant on the Treasurer for said amount, and the Treasurer shall pay the same; and this shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
