BE IT ENACTED by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation Assembled:
Section 1. That the sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of removing intruders without the limits of the Choctaw Nation.

Section 2. Be it further enacted; That upon the certificate of the Principal Chief, the National Auditor shall issue his warrant for said amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, upon the National Treasurer and he sahll pay the same, and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
