C H O C T A W N A T I O N .

AN ACT
For the relief of Peter Hudson.


WHEREAS, It appears after examining the report of Peter Hudson, ex-Superintendent of Tushkahoma Seminary, the Committee find that said Peter Hudson had to expend the sum of Two hundred and eighty-three dollars, and Ninety-seven cents, (\$283.97,), on account of the scarcity of ready money to meet the demands of the school, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation Assembled:

Section 1. That the sum of Two hundred and eighty-three dollars and Ninety seven cents, (\$283.97,), be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any school fund in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the relief of Peter Hudson.

Section 2. Be it further enacted; That the National Auditor is hereby authorized and instructed to issue his warrant on the Treasurer for said amount, and the Treasurer shall pay the same, and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
