Sir:

Referring to your letter of the 22nd instant concerning
the forwarding of all of the Acts of your National Council,
I would respectfully state that the general appropriation Acts
were not desired for the purpose of submitting them to the Department
for executive action, but they are desired in order to check
the warrants against them when they are submitted to the Indian
Agent for approval, as required by the regulations of the Secretary
of the Interior. I would also like to examine them in order
that if there was any item which should be approved by the
President you could be duly advised, for you will recall that
last year the appropriation was made for the salary of the Mining
Trustee, and not submitted, and afterwards the Secretary decided
it should have been.
