Sir:-

In consequence of a letter addressed to me from Governor McCurtain requesting that I send you all acts of the recent Choctaw Council relative to the appropriation of money, herewith enclosed please find acts as follows:

No.81. An Act making appropriation for the regular and necessary expenses of the government for the fiscal year from Oct.1, 1899 to Sept. 30, 1900.

No.80. An Act re-enacting the General appropriation Bill for 1898-1899, and eliminating therefrom the ~~xxx~~ salary of Coal trustee.

No.39.39. An act for the relief of George W. Bell.

No.76. An Act making appropriation for repairs to the Capitol Building.

These acts, being both "regular and necessary" I had deemed not necessary to send to the President, hence they have not been engrossed. All other appropriating acts have been engrossed and forwarded to your office for the action of the President.

I would request that you send me a receipt of the above Acts as our law does not permit me to allow them to go out of the office.
