C H O C T A W N A T I O N.
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AN ACT
FOR THE RELIEF OF S. H. WOODS.

WHEREAS, On the 25th day of March 1899 the official records of the National Auditor's office were destroyed by fire and it was necessary to procure new records for the office to issue warrants and protect the Nation from fraudulent claims, thus incurring an expense of Two Hundred ~~one hundred~~ dollars to replace said records, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation ASsembled: That the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty dollars (\$250.00), be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the National treasury to re-imburse S.H.Woods, and the National Auditor is hereby directed to issue his warrant on the National Treasurer for said amount in favor of S. H. Woods and the Treasurer shall pay the same, and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

An Act for the relief of S H Woods.

Whereas, On the 25th day of March 1899, the official records of the National Auditor's office were destroyed by fire and it was necessary to procure new records for the office to issue warrants and protect the Nation from fraudulent claims, thus incurring an expense of Two hundred and fifty dollars; therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled;

That the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to reimburse S. H. Woods; that the National Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant on the National Treasurer for the above amount in favor of S. H. Woods, and the said Treasurer shall pay the same. And that ^{this} act take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
