



AN ACT
REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES INDIAN
AGENT TO PAY PROF. E.H.RISHEL FOR
SERVICES RENDERED IN EXAMINING
SCHOOL TEACHERS IN JULY 1898/

We, your committee, to whom was referred the claim of Prof. E.H.Rishel for services rendered in July, 1898, in examining school teachers for the the ^hird District of the Choctaw Nation, amounting to Forty Dollars(\$40.00 have carefully examined the same and find it to be correct; but your committee is of the opinion that this amount should be paid out of the Coal and Asphalt fund of the Choctaw Nation, inasmuch as all expenses in connection with our schools incurred after June 28,1898,are payable out of said fund. Your Committee would, therefore, respectfully recommend the adoption of the following act:

BE IT ENACTED by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation Assembled That the United States Indian Agent at Muscogee, I.T., is hereby requested to pay to Professor E.H.Rishel the sum of Forty Dollars,(\$40.00), out of the Coal and Asphalt fund of the Choctaw Nation for eight days'work in examining school teachers in the Third District of the Choctaw Nation during the month of July 1898, and that this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
