Your Committee finds that the National Treasurer paid one warrant which was declared illegal by a resolution of the General Council on November 6th, 1901, which said warrant is as follows:

No. 59-I, G. W. Dukes, dated Feb. 15th, 1901, for \$1,000.00.

Our investigation shows that this warrant was issued to G. W. Dukes, then Principal Chief, to defray the expenses of the Commission that went to Washington to urge immediate action by Congress on the Supplementary agreement of February 7, 1901. We believe that it was proper for the Principal Chief to take whatever steps he deemed proper to hasten action by Congress, on the said agreement, but that the expense in connection with the trip to Washington should not have exceeded one thousand dollars. The warrant in question was for that amount, and for that purpose, and we believe that the nation should pay the same.

We would therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION, ASSEMBLED:

Section 1 That the annual report of George W. Scott, National Treasurer, for the fiscal year ended September 30th, 1902, be and the same is hereby accepted as true and correct.
