A N A C T

FOR THE CARE AND PROTECTION OF THE CAPITOL BUILDING

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION, ASSEMBLED:

Section 1 That the Principal Chief be and he is hereby authorized and directed to employ some person to take charge and control of the capitol building during the recess of the council.

Section 2 That such person so employed shall receive, as compensation for caring for and controlling the Capitol building, the sum of \$75.00, per year, to be paid quarterly, upon certificate of the Principal Chief.

Section 3 That if, in the judgment of the Principal Chief, it shall be come necessary to the proper care and protection of the capitol building, to have assistance of peace officers, he is hereby authorized to detail five national Lighthorsemen for that purpose, to be under his control and direction. Said detailed Lighthorsemen shall receive each \$2.50 per day for their services while on duty, in addition to their regular salary of \$12.50 per month, and shall be paid upon certificate of the Principal Chief.

Section 4 That there is hereby appropriated out of the National Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five hundred dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this act. That upon certificate of the Principal Chief, as aforesaid the National Auditor shall issue his warrant and the National Treasurer shall pay the same.

Section 5 That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed; and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

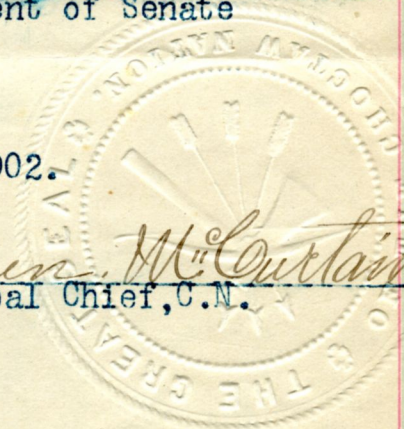

AN ACT for the care and protection of the Capitol building.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION
ASSEMBLED:

Section 1. That the Principal Chief be and he is hereby authorized and directed to employ some person to take charge and control of the Capitol building during the recesses of the council.

Section 2. That such person so employed shall receive ~~as~~ compensation for caring for and controlling the Capitol building the sum of \$75.00 per year, to be paid quarterly upon certificate of the Principal Chief.

Section 3. That if in the judgment of the Principal Chief it shall become necessary to the proper care and protection of the Capitol building to have assistance of peace officers he is hereby authorized to detail 5 national lighthorsemen for that purpose, to be under his control and direction. Said detailed lighthorsemen shall receive each 2.50 per day for their services while on duty in addition to their regular salary of \$12.50 per month, and shall be paid upon certificate of the Principal Chief.

Section 4. That there is hereby appropriated out of the national treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of \$500.- or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this act. That upon certificate of the Principal Chief as aforesaid the national auditor shall issue his warrant and the national treasurer shall pay the same.

Section 5. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. And this act shall ^{and be in force} take effect from and after its passage and approval.
