A N A C T
FOR THE RELIEF OF CERTAIN INDIAN POLICE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION, ASSEMBLED:

Section 1 That the sum of four hundred and seventeen dollars, ~~be and the same is~~ hereby appropriated, out of any money in the National Treasury not otherwise appropriated to pay certain Indian Policemen for services rendered the Choctaw Nation, during the regular session of October, 1902, as follows:

Section 3 That this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and approval.

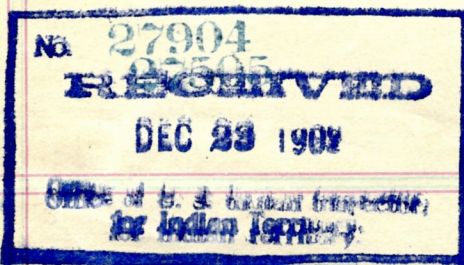
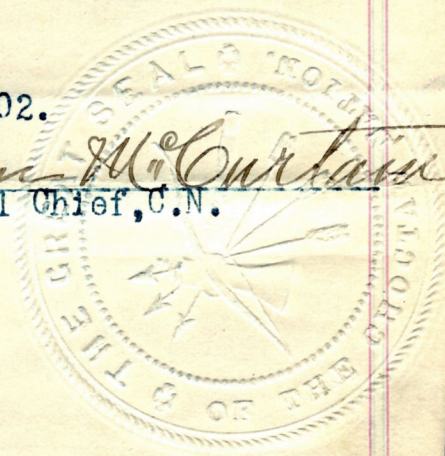

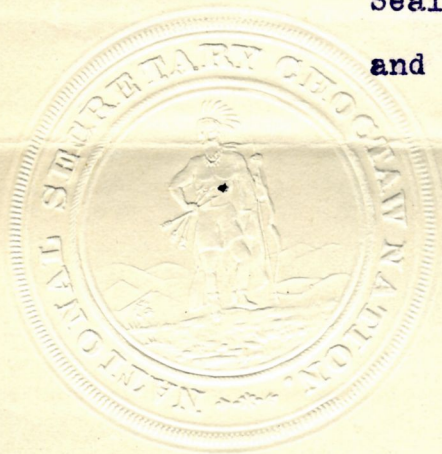
