I have to respectfully advise you that the resolution of the General Council of the Choctaw Nation, approved by the Principal Chief December 12, 1902 and entitled "A resolution endorsing the action of the convention of the Five Civilized Tribes held at Eufaula, Indian Territory, November 28, 1902, was transmitted by this office to the Department, and I am in receipt of a communication from the Honorable Acting Secretary of the Interior, dated January 13, 1903, wherein he says that it is not deemed necessary to submit said resolution to the President for executive action, and that the resolution was transmitted to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs for the files of his office.
