TO THE HONORABLE ETHAN ALLEN HITCHCOCK, SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR:

The General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled most respectfully represent that under the Atoka agreement, concluded between the United States Government and the Choctaw and Chickasaw Nation, it was agreed that all the funds due the members comprising said Nations were to be pr capitalized and paid to the members thereof, as soon as practicable after the expiration of tribal govwe realize that ernment. We further represent that a full settlement can not be had at this time. by reason of the fact, that the coal and asphalt lands yet remain to be sold, as well as the surplus lands, together with the funds accruing from the sale of town lots and ather public buildings, not yet being available for this purpose. We respectfully powers; The Irust Funds and all other suggest that all funds that have been placed to the credit of the Choctaw and Chickasaw people up to kke date, be paid out per capita, at the earliest possible date. This suggestion is prompted by

the knowledge of the true condition of the Choctaw and Chickasaw

allottees who are striking to build homes and otherwise improve

their allotments.

Department upon this suggestion herein contained, would do much to encourage the fullblood Indians, who are trying to abandon the customs and traditions that have retarded their progress in the past, and are making a sicere effort to keep pace with the progress and enlightenment, that a change in the land tenures has forced upon them.
