

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF H.P. WARD, COUNTY JUDGE, ATOKA COUNTY.

WHEREAS, A warrant heretofore issued and given to H.P. Ward, County Judge Atoka County, on July 2nd, 1906 for salary from April 1, 1906, to June 30th, 1906, No. 202 C for the amount of sixty-two dollars and fifty cents; and,

WHEREAS, said warrant has been lost or misplaced and after diligent search has not been found; therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION IN EXTRAORDINARY SESSION ASSEMBLED:

That the National Auditor is hereby authorized to issue a duplicate warrant to the said H.P. Ward covering this amount, and that the same shall be paid as provided in section 11 of the Act of Congress approved April 6, 1906, entitled "An Act to provide for the final disposition of the affairs of the Five Civilized Tribes, and for other purposes".

This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the President.
