

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF ROBERT HARRISON, COUNTY CLERK,
ATOKA COUNTY.

NATIONAL SECRETARY, CHOCTAW NATION.

WHEREAS, a National Warrant heretofore issued on July 2nd, 1906, to Robert Harrison, County Clerk, Atoka County, for salary from April 1, 1906, to June 30th, 1906, No. 203 C for the amount of twenty-five dollars; and

WHEREAS, has been lost or misplaced and after diligent search can not be found; therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION IN EXTRAORDINARY SESSION ASSEMBLED:

That the National Auditor is hereby authorized to issue a duplicate warrant to said Robert Harrison covering this amount, and that the same shall be paid as provided in section 11 of the act of Congress approved April 26, 1906, entitled "An Act to provide for the final disposition of the affairs of the Five Civilized Tribes, and for other purposes".

That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the President.
