Jan. 27.

The Choctaw council adjourned this afternoon, having been in session all the week. The principal matter considered was the Dawes commission. It developed that the council was at present opposed to any material change in the tribal relations of the nation, but a strong sentiment was developed in favor of statehood in the near future. On Tuesday Messrs. Kidd and McKennon of the commission addressed the council and made a strong impression.

The council appointed the following delegates to confer with the commission: John Harrison, Joe Everidge, John Turnbull, A. Telle, John Wilson, Josiah Gardner, N. B. Ainsworth, Sam Holson, James Dyer, H. C. Harris, G. W. Duke and Mitchell Harrison.

These delegates will meet the delegates from the Chickasaw nation at McAlester on Thursday, Feb. 15, and have a conference with

the Dawes commission on Monday, the 19th.

The council ratified some leases of coal mines made by the Chickasaw council in that nation. It also granted a charter for the Choctaw and Chickasaw national railway, which is to be built from Fort Smith, Ark., to Duncan, I. T.

W. A. Durant was appointed superintendent of Jones academy at Hartshorne, I. T., in place of Simon Dwight, deceased. The other business transacted was of a purely local nature and unimportant.
