EDITORIAL ON CONVENTION OF TUSHKAHOMA PARTY

Pursuant to a call by the Hon. Joseph Garland, county chairman, a convention of the Tushkahoma party, met at San Bois, Indian Territory, on June 22nd for the purpose of nominating a candidate for the party for the office of County Representative.

The convention was called to order by the chairman, who also stated the object of the meeting, and thereupon the convention was proclaimed ready for the transaction of business.

It was moved by Green McCurtain and seconded by N. H. Cooper, to select a committee of three to draft rules governing the convention was carried.

Green McCurtain, Norris H. Cooper and Frank Folsom were selected as the committee to draft rules and were instructed to report at one o'clock to the convention.

At one o'clock the committee submitted its report which was adopted.

Jonas Thompson then announced himself as a candidate for

the office of County Representative.

Turner McGilberry announced himself as a candidate for the office with the statement that if he should receive the nomination, he would immediately resign the office of sheriff of the county.

Upon balloting Turner McGilberry received thirty-five and Jonas Thompson received eleven votes, and Turner McGilberry was declared the nominee of the convention.

Upon motion by Green McCurtain and seconded by Norris Cooper to endorse the proceedings of the convention of the party held at Tushkahoma last October, which was called by the National Chairman in consistency with the customs and usages of the party in nominating candidates for National offices, wherein the different sections of the Nation were well represented by good men of the Tushkahoma party out of their respective counties, not in any manner to admit any irregularity in the convention but to offset some dissatisfaction on the part of a few whose loyalty to the party has been seriously questioned, and whose purpose if successful would be to create strife in the ranks, was unanimously carried.
