

AN ACT.

*One Hundred*

Appropriating ~~████████~~ Dollars To Mrs. J.F.McCurtain for cleaning up Capitol building and making necessary repairs thereon.

Whereas, Mrs. J.F.McCurtain has had the care and custody of the Capitol building at Tuskahoma for the past year, and has repaired leaks in the roof, fixed the belfry, and protected the same from depredation; and

Whereas, the steps of said building in some places are decayed and broken down and need repairing; and

Whereas, an appropriation of ~~████████~~ dollars is needed to pay Mrs. McCurtain for what she has already done about said building and to make other small repairs that are necessary; therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION ASSEMBLED:

*One Hundred*  
That the sum of ~~████████~~ dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any funds of the Choctaw Nation for the purpose of paying for the care and custody of the Capitol building at Tuskahoma, for repairing leaks in the roof, for fixing the belfry, and for making repairs on the steps and other necessary small repairs on said building; and that the National Auditor is directed to draw his warrant for said sum in favor of Mrs. J.F.McCurtain in said amount for said purposes.

That this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

APPROPRIATING ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS TO MRS. J.F. McCURTAIN FOR  
CLEANING THE CAPITOL BUILDING AND MAKING NECESSARY REPAIRS.

WHEREAS, Mrs. J.F. McCurtain has had the care and custody of the Capitol building at Tuskeggee for the past year, and has repaired leaks in the roof, fixed the belfry, and protected the same from depredation and damage; and

WHEREAS, The steps of said building in some places are decayed and broken down and need repairing; and

WHEREAS, An appropriation of One Hundred dollars is needed to pay Mrs. McCurtain for what she has already done about said building and to make other small repairs that are necessary; therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION ASSEMBLED;

THAT THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS BE AND THE SAME is hereby appropriated out of any funds of the Choctaw Nation for the purpose of paying for repairing leaks in the roof of the Capitol building, for fixing the belfry, and for making repairs on the steps, and other necessary small repairs on said building; and that the National Auditor is directed to draw his warrant for said sum in favor of Mrs. J.F. McCurtain in said amount for said purposes.

That this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
