

You are advised that the following disposition has been made of acts and a resolution of the Choctaw Council, as indicated below:

Memorial, approved by the Principal Chief October 7, 1908 in reference to the disposition of the coal and asphalt lands and deposits. This memorial did not require executive action and the Department held, on December 2, 1908, that the same would be transmitted to Congress in due time.

Bill No. 3, approved by the Principal Chief October 7, 1908, concerning the disposition of the unallotted lands and protesting against the establishment of a forest reserve.

This bill did not require executive action.

Bill No. 5, approved by the Principal Chief October 14, 1908, protesting against the reopening of the Choctaw and Chickasaw rolls. The Department held, on November 30, 1908, that the same did not require executive action but would be

transmitted for executive action in due time.
