

An Act entitled An act prohibiting
citizen or citizens to employ noncitizens or
noncitizens to take charge stock of any
kind as herdsmen.

Be it enacted by the General Council of
the Choctaw Nation assembled,

That it shall not be lawful for any
citizen or citizens of this nation to employ
noncitizen or noncitizens to take charge of
his or her cattle, horses, mules, sheep, goats
or hogs, or stock of any kind, and to hunt
or gather stock of any kind running in
the range, within the limits of this
nation under any consideration, This
act is not ^{to} be construed to prevent citizens
from employing noncitizens to take
charge ~~of stock~~ ^{to feed} in pen
or pasture, and any person or persons
charged with violation of this act
shall upon conviction in the circuit

Court having jurisdiction, be fined in a sum not less than two hundred and fifty nor more than five hundred dollars in the discretion of the court one half of which fine shall go to the National Treasury for national purposes and the other half to the informant.

Be it further enacted, That any act or part of any acts in anywise coming in conflict with the provision of this act is hereby repealed and this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
