Bill No 13

A Resolution asking for the relief of Mother M. Virginia,

Whereas under an agreement of October 6-1897 by and between J. W. Erwin Superintendent of Public Instructions for Choctaw Nation of the first Part and Mother M. Virginia of St Agnes Academy an Antlers Indian Territory of the second Part the Choctaw Nation placed 6 girls in St Agnes Academy and agreed to pay the sum of six hundred and sixty dollars, \$660⁰⁰ for the maintenance of said girls during the scholastic year of 1897 and 1898 and

Whereas under the above agreement Mother M. Virginia did receive board furnish books, tuition, clothing, and medical attention, and has not received compensation therefor.

Therefore, Be it resolved by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled: That the Secretary of the Interior be and he is hereby authorized and requested to pay unto Mother M. Virginia the sum of six hundred and sixty dollars, (\$660⁰⁰) the same to be paid out of the school fund of the Choctaw Nation now in the sub Treasury of the United States at St Louis Mo. and that this resolution take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
