

Bill No 33 Resolution
Asking that the Land Office at Atoka & Ardmore, when Consolidated be located at Coal gate, I.T.

Whereas it has been Authoritatively Stated that after January 1, 1906, the Land Office at Atoka I.T. and at Ardmore, I.T. would be Consolidated into one Office; And

Whereas as a matter of Convenience Coal gate, I.T. Offers more railway facilities for the Convenience of the Choctaw & Chickasaw people than either Atoka or Ardmore; And

Whereas The people of Coal gate offer to furnish free of charge, a suitable building and such other Accommodations as will suit the Convenience of the employes; Therefore

Be it resolved by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled,

That Commissioner Tama Bibby, be most respectfully requested to locate land office at Coal gate, and that a copy of this resolution be furnished him as conveying the sense of this body.

And that this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Bill No 34 Memorial

To the Congress of the United States;

We your memorialist, the General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled,

most respectfully represent that under the terms of the present treaties with the Government our tribal government ends on March 4, 1906.

We further represent that our tribal schools will also close at that time unless remedial legislation is had continuing said schools for the scholastic term.

We therefore most respectfully urge such legislation by your body as will continue said tribal schools to the end of the scholastic term on May 1906.
