Bill no 61  
Memorial  
To Congress relating to the Good Land  
Indian Industrial School.

We, your memorialist, the General Council  
of the Choctaw Nation assembled,  
Respectfully represent that the old Good  
Land Indian Industrial School is an  
old institution that has been of  
incalculable benefit to the Choctaw  
people in the up building of the moral  
character of the Indian youths of the  
Choctaw Nation  
that its religious and educational  
training has been of the highest order,  
and your memorialist feel that it  
is appropriate to make some provision  
for the continuance of said school an  
orphan's home for Indian children -

We your memorialist therefore  
request your honorable body to  
appropriate, for the benefit of

said school, six hundred and forty  
acres of land from the unallotted lands  
of the Choctaw or Chickasaw Nations  
and also that the same be designated  
and set aside to school for this  
purpose by the Commissioner to the  
five civilized tribes.

- an act -

For the relief of C. H. Wilson, and others  
to Defray their expenses to Washington D. C.

Whereas The President of the United States has  
seen fit to call our Principal Chief,  
and other members of our tribes to  
Washington for consultation with  
reference to the closing of our tribal  
Affairs.

- Therefore -

Be it enacted by the General Council  
of the Choctaw Nation assembled.

That the sum of seven hundred & fifty  
dollars, or so much thereof as may  
be necessary be and the same is  
hereby appropriated to defray the  
expenses of Green M. Curtain, Principal  
Chief, C. H. Wilson, National Secretary,  
P. S. Lester, Hampton Turner, Geo. W. Choate,  
Geo. W. Scott, Peter Hudson and James  
Culbertson, out of any money in the  
National Treasury not otherwise  
appropriated for this purpose, and the  
National Auditor shall draw his  
warrant for the same and the
