EDITORIAL ON CREEK COUNCIL

Nov. 6.

The Creek council, which has been in session at Okmulgee for (the past thirty days, adjourned this evening. The last days of the session were very interesting. The most important bills were held 'back to the last. A permit bill, taxing each non-citizen \$12 per year, was passed. This law was repealed in 1892, on the recommendation of Chief Perryman, but a strong pressure was brought to bear and it was re-enacted as before.

A bill was passed authorizing the distributing per capita of \$60,000, which will be drawn out of the treasury at Washington.

Capt. G. W. Grayson of Eufaula and Hon. A. H. McKellop of Muscogee, present attorney general of the Creek nation, were elected national delegates to Washington during the next congress.
