CREEK CAPITOL

The above cut is the Creek Capitol building at Okmulgee. It is built of cut stone, two stories high and inclosed by a stone wall made of solid masonry, containing about one acre of ground. The yard around the house has some beautiful trees and presents a handsome appearance. The Capitol building has been standing only a few years. Before this house was erected the Creeks held their council meetings in a large two-story log house. This house has ample room to accommodate all of the executive officials as well as a supreme court room and chambers for both the Kings and Warriors. Ere long, it too, will be a monument of the Creek Nation's once great Independence, but tenantless.
