CLINTON B. FISK TO SAML. CHECOTE

Saratoga Springs N.Y.

My Dear Sir:

Your favor of the 16th inst meets me here on my way homeward from a tour to the "Thousand Islands" river St. Lawrence Montreal, Lake Champlain and Lake George, whither I have been with my family, and to speak at the great International Temperance Camp meeting at "Thousand Island Park".

I will give immediate attention to the important matter, to which you invite my attention. The Interior Department should promptly come to your relief by driving out the intruders, and I shall be only too glad in aiding you in securing their early expulsion. Bad white men have had much to do in creating and continuing the unhappy condition of things that has afflicted the Muskogee Nation. The Government of the United States has made solemn covenants with your people and should be diligent in keeping them, and every one of them. The "Country" is yours and all yours by most sacred obligation and I will do my utmost to help maintain that covenant.

The late adjustment at Muskogee has given great satisfaction at Washington and all over the United States, I trust that the agreement upon which we invoked the blessing of God will be observed in letter and spirit, and that peace and prosperity may abound in all the borders of the Creek Country. The approaching elections and the meeting of the Council will be very important events. If wisdom, patience, and the spirit of concession shall govern them the future will be bright.

I shall be glad to aid you at anytime my services may be useful to yourself or people.

With cordial greetings for Secy. Callahan and other friends I am with very great respect.
