CREEK TROUBLE

May 15 has been definitely decided upon as the date for beginning the payment of the loyal Creek fund. Most of the payment will be made at Muskogee, but a small portion will be disposed of at Okmulgee. The payments will be made by check. The largest estate in this fund is that of the late Topoth Yahola, who was chief of the Northern or loyal Creeks. His heirs will get \$6,000. There are many who trace descent from Yahola, but until this week it was believed he had no lineal descendent. However, a young Creek has now come forward with the claim that he is the great-grandson of the chief. He says he will enjoin the agency from paying the money to the other heirs.
