It will be entirely satisfactory to us for you to proceed as outlined in your letter of April 14th.


It is perhaps pertinent to mention at this time that the children we use should be not older than five years old, as when they get eight or nine they are about finished.

In case however that you think the chap is good material for your business after seeing him, I will advance her the money for her to come out there so that you may make whatever contract is necessary in relation to the same.

I have no disposition to be interested in the contract. The only interest I have in the matter was this: That he was such a remarkable boy that I felt sure that when you give him a try-out you will feel that you have really got an addition worth while to your Company. your letter of April 2nd.


If you care to bring the
