Dear Sir:

Mr. Horsley has been appointed chairman of the District Committee of the State Bar of Oklahoma and, as you probably know, is in Europe at this time on a vacation. I am writing you this letter for him in order to call your attention to a matter that might, at least some time, prove important to you.

It is essential that every person admitted to practice law in this State pay a certain fee in order to be entitled to a place on the roster of attorneys in Oklahoma. The attorneys are divided into two classes, active and inactive. Those who anticipate the active practice of law must pay a fee of \$8.00 for the balance of this year and the next year or \$3.00 for this year. Unless this is done within the next few days, those desiring to practice are prohibited from doing so under a rather severe penalty.

Inactive attorneys are those who do not engage actively in the practice of their professions but who, nevertheless, have sufficient pride in their professions and personal accomplishments to keep up their memberships in the lawyers' organization. They should get on the inactive list so that, should the future require them to again enter active practice, they will be in a position to do so. Inactive members of the State Bar must pay \$3.00 a year and this must be sent in within the next few days.

For Mr. Horsley I wish to solicit your prompt attention to these matters to the end that Seminole County may be enrolled in the State Bar 100% strong.
