(After your folks died you inherited the land?)

No, that was my allotment.

(Oh, your own allotment?)

Yeah.

(And while all that time he was appointed your guardian he was leasing out all of that land and collecting the money himself?)

I don't know where the money went to.

(In other words, all the money while you were there was three dollars.)

Yes, \$3.50.

(Three fifty and then when you left that fall after you got the crop in--)

No it was in the summer after the crop was laid by in July or August. Then she gave me the ten dollars to go on.

(Well, \$13.50.)

Yes.

(And he leased your land?)

Well, I went--there was a little store there. It was sorta a little general merchandising. And what little clothes that I go there and what few things
