Across that. He lived back to the left, before you're going towards Terecita. There's a tall hill and trees going around it. There's still some houses in there. I don't know that they-- And his name was Tom Groundhog that lived in there. I can't remember his first name. I haven't thought of it in years. I can't remember. You ever come down the street--you know where that big spring is? Well, it's up on the creek, and there's a sharp turn in the road right there, you know. For about a mile back up there, you come on down past the yellow house on the right of the road. Well you had him going.

(Yeah, horse and buggy was the only--)

That's where Redbird lived.

(Yeah.)

That hill was Redbird hill. It's about half-mile, no about a quarter I guess. My son lives right at the bottom of that hill.
