Yes, they should have the last say so about where the freeze should be lifted and if they feel like it's their best interest if its lifted then the Secretary of Interior should be concerned to lift this freeze and if it's best interest for the freeze to remain, I think this Secretary of Interior of ours should act as a Secretary of Interior in line of his duty and should be deeply concerned what the Indians and the Natives of Alaska should have their choice to what they'd rather have.

(Oh, I think that about concludes my questions unless you have something else you'd like to say. I just wanted to get your impression on that.)

Well, I might add just one more thing, if a leader of a group of people which I see in my picture as I mentioned before, I let my Cherokee people decide their wishes and then I act on their wishes and try to carry out their request. And the Secretary of the Interior, regardless of rank that you may hold I think there should be a line drawn to who may decide what action by whom and who should request these to whom. I think that just about answers all the questions that could be a support toward the Indians in our country.

(I see. Well thank you very much again.)
