(But that was a little different. I had tobacco fixed that time. But for myself. It wasn't against somebody or anything like that. I don't believe in that. I don't believe in bad medicine ; I believe in good medicine.) My Dad knows how to do that.

(Un-huh)

You know if it's tobacco, but he won't fix it anymore.

(Un-huh)

I don't know. I guess it does some good, I've never tried it. (Yeah)

I know people have used it and say it's good but I've never tried it myself. (Well, I'd have to say that time, maybe it was all in my mind, but my head-ache
