all day, load wagons and team of wagons. They were using a team of wagon to haul gravel to scatter on the roads. They used to use the teams to grade the roads. They used to use a fresno--what they called it with teams to grade a road. Way back in 1936.

It was the middle of July--right hot day--I was busting up some cook wood. Well, that noon I come in for dinner and I asked my mad, I said, "Mother is dinner ready? I am sure hungry." I took them with me out there in the shade and I spread that old quilt on the ground--under the shade tree. I prayed and asked the Lord to teach me the Cherokee alphabet The Cherokee Bibles only is Cherokee reading or writing. And so in about twenty-five minutes I was reading all the alphabet. And I was reading the That is -- some people don't believe me, but it is truth. Cherokee Bible. And my parents didn't even know that I had learned the Cherokee aphabet until two years later. And why they found out, we were going to Sunday School and it was my time to read -- we were reading verses. And my turn came up to read, and I just opened my mouth and I just went on reading. And I just thought no use in me keeping a secret that I learned the alphabet, so I just opened my mouth and went to reading . Let the whole congregation hear me reading. They all were surprised. Surprised and glad. That was the first time that my mother -- she had tears broken out because she was so glad that I learned how to read. Then she asked me when I learned to read. I said, "About two years ago." Said, "That long?" And
