(Un-huh. So they didn't have any welfare? And they didn't have any--)

Well there was a little I think through the agency. He used to come around
us once in a while. About once every two or three months.

(If they saw somebody hard up, would they do anything about this?)

Yeah, they'd give you a can of beer, something like that.

(Wouldn't they give you a big order of groceries if they thought--?)

No. Not then.

(Not then.)

Maybe they did some places, I don't know.

(They'd, the agents would come around in cars or--?)

No, these were farm agents. I think these were the same as Indian agents,
I guess.
