(Un-hum.)

We don't ever get a notice hardly. Superintendent at Haskell.

(Un-huh)

So I thought they're getting along pretty good.

(Yeah, it must mean they're doing O.K. if they don't write home to you about them.)

NO RACIAL PREJUDICE

(Well do you think that the children experience any feelings of prejudice against them? The Cherokee people here in this part of the country? In other words, White people being prejudice against them?)

Might be some places.

(Some, un-huh.)

Yeah, could be in some places.

(How does this usually manifest itself? How do the Indian people usually notice this?) •

(Well, like when they walk in a store, a restaurant, a business, or a school or---)

Well, I just don't know that. I guess most of us has been treated alright, I guess. As far as I know.

(Un-huh)

And some of them are not I guess, especially these hospitals.

(Oh, that's right. I forget to mention those. 'Course now at the Indian hospital usually that's most of the patients are Indian, aren't they? But they personel they're quite frequently--the majority of them are White, aren't they?)

That's right.

(You feel like that might be one of the places, if there were any?)
