Lucy Logan Griggs was born on the Sac and Fox Reservation near what is now Stroud, Oklahcma. She is 64 years of age and is a full blood Sac and Fox. She has lived in Oklahoma City for many years, but maintains close contact with Sac and Fox friends and relatives in Stroud and Shawnee, Oklahoma. She attended school at the Sac and Fox Mission School in Stroud, Carlisle Institute in Carlisle, Pennsylvania and Chilocco Indian School. Her Indian name is Ta-shi-tha-qua.
