Ten members to organize and then get a charter. So we had to call a meeting and people from the state: state president, state secretary, and so and so, came. I remember the time and Raymond White was there. He helped us. Charley Whiten.

(Un-hun.)

So we--there was enough of us. We really had a hard time deciding the name.
