Then we have the activities that took place, would be the dancing.

(Was that all that happened?)

No, we would dance all afternoon.

(Did you have a dinner before that?)

No, this is the morning, see? It wasn't dinner time yet. We would have dances and at noon, (words not clear), we had dinner. Everybody would eat dinner, gather together, and about 1 o'clock or 1:30, why, we would start in the program again.

(And your program and then you just all eat, and after dinner, you'd just start dancing?)
