He stayed here day or two, then he then went back to Washington. That was the first place he went to, the Supreme Court Building. And when he got to the building, went in, the procedure were already there. The procedure that was to be started there, was already there ahead of him. Beat the Chief there. And he inquired about it. He inquired' probably the secretary of the court. He said, "Yes Chief, it's already been started." And as I have said, this was probably given by the secretary and it already before the court. And was being considered. And when he went in there, he went and set in the building or in the hall, where he was invited to go in that court, that maybe it had to be considered, and maybe had to have few words of testimony on this. And that is the reason that he was called in. And when he went it, he was telling me that they was already making their decisions and that was already was gonna to vote on it, I don't know if they vote on those or not. But all the other justices told him that they went along the way decision was sent in with the exception of one. And that was Judge Frankfurter, and he was the only one that didn't go along with them. And all the other justices went along, with the Chief on this decision. That was one of the times that he went up there for the benefit of the Kiowa Indians. And he was triumphant in this case. And it wasn't very long before we got what we call the annuity payment. Our annuity payments were started. And that was the decision of the Supreme Court, with the exception of one Judge Frankfurter.
