(So it could help from what you've heard.)
Uh-huh.

(Along the line of employment and things.)

Yeah, I think it can be a help.

People ain't got jobs and want to work.

(Well thank you Glen for talking to me.)

Well, if I've been any help to you.

(Well you have. And next time you think of more stories to tell me, well let me know so I can get them down on tape.) (laughter)

I can't laugh in front of anybody--I twist--I can't whistle.

(Well we'll turn our heads.)

No you bring it back down here some of these times and I'll put that on for you. Okay)

When you come back--I've got a headache. I wasn't lying to you awhile ago. The sinuses bother me pretty bad. You be back--you said you were coming back.

(Yeah I be back.)

Come to see her. You bring it--I'll take it in there and I'll take it in there. I'll sing a little song. There isn't anyone around here that knows it.

(Okay. Well that'll be good, okay.)
