(Un-hun)

My Dad lives with us and but he's pretty old so he can't watch them and we have to get somebody to stay with him too at the same time we get somebody to stay with our boys. But our baby-sitting bill doesn't run very high.

(Yeah, that keeps it down doesn't it as long as it stays in the family?),

(Well Louella, growing up around here and everything, I know that you've probably noticed a lot of changes but what would you say that would be, probably, the predominate problem of the Cherokee tribe. I mean some of the things that they are concerned with today that you think could be helped.

Or that would be better for them?)

I would say that health and education and the housing conditions.

(Un-hun)

Well not particularly in that order cause you know there's more Indian kids going to school now.

(Un-hun, well this housing project that the tribe has, is that working out
