GENERAL SUBJECT: LIFE/HISTORY MATERIALS AND RELATED SUBJECTS

BACKGROUND OF INFORMANT:

John Christie was born in Indian Territory, in 1888, near present Stilwell, Oklahoma, in Adair County. His father was John Christie and his mother's parents were of the Adair family. John has a very good memory of people and events in both Adair and Craig Counties. He moved to the Vinita area at the age of 16 years. He has been a farmer and worked for the railroad. John Christie is a full blood Cherokee Indian.
