You know they just go, you know, just certain preacher come by this house, you know, maybe next house next Sunday.

(Yes.)

It just went that a way, you know. Down there where Joe Groundhog's mother lived--down there in the field down there. There used to be a log house down there. And they used to, lot of them go there, you know. They all go to Church on Sunday.

OLD CEMETERIES

(And now the old cemeteries are any of them still preserved that you used a long time ago?)

Well there's one right up here, you know, The Terrapin place. Just a family, you know, has that. Family, you know, they just have plot up there for the family. Then there's one up there in Tooley Hollow. I mean way up there by (word not clear) an old graveyard there, you know. Been there for years and years. They call it Tooley's place. And there's one over there in the fields where John lives, over there. Field there that's Hick graveyard.

(Hick.)

And that's where my mother's buried.

-(Well.)

And then there's one up\(interruption.)

(Yes, ma'am.)

That's where the Buckhorns \ are all buried.
